



# TUESDAY MARCH 24 BRIEFING

The attendees for Workshop IPC – ISHAC Milano 2009, numbering over 600, have been treated to 2 days of stimulating discussions, break-out sessions, simulations, & live case demonstrations.

Highlights from Sunday's Physician Workshop included lectures on advanced imaging to help deliver intracardiac devices safely and effectively, as well as a thorough description of common interventional techniques (ASD, PFO, PDA, & VSD closure, as well as balloon valvuloplasty/angioplasty for CHD). Also, advanced techniques in stent and percutaneous valve therapy were discussed.

The Workshop for Nurses and X Ray Technicians was also very highly attended, nearing 100 in number. Stimulating discussions in cardiac catheterization responsibilities and techniques, along with new Hybrid therapies and the psycho-social aspects of treating patients with CHD were enjoyed by all.

The day culminated in a New Technologies Overview, sponsored by industry, with a wrap up lecture on the humanitarian efforts of Associazione Bambini Cardiopatici nel Mondo and a beautiful story of The Valpolicella Wine Experience. Accordingly, all attendees were treated to a wonderful 2003 Amarone wine.

Monday, the I<sup>st</sup> official day of IPC – ISHAC, began with a bang! Fetal and neonatal cardiac interventions were discussed and debated along with conventional surgical alternatives. Complex stenting of CHD was also presented, highlighted by a live case demonstration of implantation of the Medtronic Melody Valve by our host, Mario Carminati, and assisted by his former pupil, Philipp Bonhoeffer, with a lively discussion of the procedure by the panel and attendees. Also, severe CoA, both in the thoracic and abdominal aorta were

treated "on screen" with excellent results. In addition to other popular live cases, expert lectures in intracardiac closure devices and interventional therapy in adults with CHD kept the audience attentive. The day culminated in the ever popular *Nightmares in the Cath lab*, championed by the international winner of the award, Neil Wilson.

Everyone is anxious for Tuesday to arrive when the faculty will concentrate on lively discussions on PFO closure, RVOT dysfunction, Structural Heart Disease, and a how-to session on treating CoA. There will be more live case demonstrations, which always gets everyone involved. The session will end with the IPC Awards, after which everyone will be treated to a wonderful drive and Gala experience at Villa San Carlo Borromeo.

## Different Imaging Modalities...

The closed ties between different imaging modalities and interventional procedures were demonstrated during the first two days of the meeting. CT and MRI provide significant anatomical information to the catheterize before the intervention. However two and three dimensional echocardiography remains the preferable modality for the non invasive imaging of congenital heart disease before interventional procedure. Tranthoracic, transesophageal and intracardiac approaches are being used as guidance for the transcatheter intervention. The roll of three dimensional echocardiography is not established yet but it seems to provide further information in cases of fenestrated atrial septal defects and flail mitral valve.
